Fall always offers the promise of new beginnings. That is especially the case with Trinity Cathedral this year as we look forward to stirring concerts, thought-provoking education, and inspiring worship.

I'll mention just a few highlights.

Hold the date of Friday, Oct. 12, for the Fall Choral Concert. In addition to works by Boulanger and Bairstow, a performance of Leonard Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms* will honor the composer's 100th birthday.

On Oct. 17, at the BrownBag Concert, soprano Kristine Caswelch will offer a tribute to Julie Andrews. In Advent, BrownBag Concerts will anticipate Christmas with jazz (The Gateway Band on Nov. 28), a seasonal standard (Britten's *Ceremony of Carols* on Dec. 5), and the annual *Messiah* sing (on Dec. 12).

Sunday morning forums will feature the Poet Laureate of Ohio, highlight distinctive ministries of the cathedral, and offer updates on current concerns, such as the #MeToo movement, sanctuary churches, and the Cleveland Police Consent Decree.

These are only a few highlights. Consider also the offering of Evensong on Wednesday evenings (Oct. 3 to Dec. 12), and strong "First Wednesday" discussions on contemporary issues. We look forward to greeting you at Trinity!
